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

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Passage 2

Throughout the world, countries are experiencing a need to protect their populations and productive capacities from climate change. At the same time, each country has the responsibility to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and its contribution to a global problem. These two goals require significant adaptation and mitigation efforts as countries adapt to a new lifestyle. Thailand has begun implementing strategies to adapt to climate change, to mitigate some effects and to protect farmland, coasts and cities. The lessons learned will prove useful to Thailand as it faces future climate challenges, and can be referenced by other Southeast Asian countries with similar situations.

The effects of climate change, including higher surface temperatures, floods, droughts, severe storms and sea level rise, put Thailand's rice crops at risk and threaten to submerge Bangkok within 20 years. The damage to agriculture, coastal tourism, and the capital city as consequences of climate change will have enormous economic, cultural and environmental impacts. Thailand's mitigation and adaptation efforts include a slow shift to organic agriculture, a tsunami warning system along the Andaman Sea, the construction of a flood prevention wall around Bangkok, and an Action Plan to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from vehicles and energy use.

Inspiration starts here

The two teachers who were shot alongside their students at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas died trying to protect their students after a gunman burst into their classroom, barricaded the doors and opened fire with a semi-automatic rifle. Nineteen children, aged 9 and 10, were killed in the attack, along with Eva Mireles and Irma Garcia. Garcia's nephew wrote on Twitter that his aunt "passed away with children in her arms trying to protect them." He went on to say, "Those weren't just her students they were her kids as well." However, the 18-year-old gunman was killed on the scene by law enforcement officials, too.

The gunman legally bought two AR-style rifles before the attack, soon after his 18th birthday, and warned on social media minutes before the attack that he had shot his grandmother and was going to shoot up a school. "I just don't know how people can sell that type of a gun to a kid 18 years old," Eliahna's aunt, Siria Arizmendi, said angrily through tears.

The dead included an outgoing 10-year-old, Eliahna Garcia, who loved to sing, dance and play basketball; a fellow fourth grader, Xavier Javier Lopez, who had been eagerly awaiting a summer of swimming; and a teacher, Eva Mireles, with 17 years' experience whose husband is an officer with the school district's police department.

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
