คำนำสำนักพิมพ์

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คำนำผู้เรียบเรียง

Jakkrit International Dictionary เล่มนี้ ถูกจัดพิมพ์ขึ้นมาเพื่อใช้ในการอ้างอิงคำศัพท์ ที่ใช้ในการเล่นเกมต่อศัพท์ภาษาอังกฤษ (Scrabble หรือ Crossword) ในระดับนานาชาติและ ระดับประเทศ คำศัพท์ที่เป็น Main entry ใน Jakkrit International Dictionary จะประกอบ ด้วยอักษรตั้งแต่ 2 ถึง 8 ตัวอักษร ที่ใช้ได้ทั้งในระบบการเล่นแบบ OSPD (ระบบที่อ้างอิงคำศัพท์ใน ประเทศสหรัฐอเมริกา อิสราเอล มาลต้า แคนาดา และการแข่งขันในประเทศไทย) และในระบบ การเล่นแบบ SOWPODS (ระบบที่อ้างอิงคำศัพท์ในกลุ่มประเทศสหราชอาณาจักร ออสเตรเลีย ญี่ปุ่น เป็นต้น

ผู้เขียนได้เรียบเรียงคำแปลของศัพท์ในรูปแบบที่เหมาะกับการจำเพื่อใช้ในการเล่นเกม ต่อศัพท์ภาษาอังกฤษ ดังนั้นคำแปลของคำศัพท์แต่ละคำจะถูกจำกัดความหมายเฉพาะที่มาจาก รูปผัน (inflection) ที่ผันได้มากที่สุด เช่น AMBITION จะถูกแปลในรูปของคำกริยาว่า To seek with eagerness (ค้นหาหรือปรารถนาอย่างแรงกล้า) แต่ไม่มีคำแปลในรูปของคำนามว่า ความ - ทะเยอทะยาน ทั้งนี้เพื่อประโยชน์ในการเล่นเกมต่อศัพท์ภาษาอังกฤษเพราะสามารถผันรูปเป็น AMBITIONED, AMBITIONING และ AMBITIONS ถ้าท่านต้องการดูความหมายในรูปผันอื่นๆ ท่านสามารถเปิดดูได้ใน Unabridged Merriam-Webster Dictionary (U.S.A) หรือ The Chamber Dictionary (U.K)

จากประสบการณ์ของผู้เขียนในการเล่นเกมต่ออักษรภาษาอังกฤษมาเป็นเวลาหลายปี ทำให้ทราบถึงวิธีการจำคำศัพท์ที่ใช้ได้ผลดีสำหรับผู้เขียนเอง นั่นคือการจดจำคำศัพท์แบบลูกโช่ ต่อเนื่องและการจัดกลุ่มคำศัพท์โดยอ้างอิงความหมาย ผู้เขียนให้ความสำคัญของความหมายมากเพราะ จะทำให้สามารถจำคำศัพท์ได้นาน อย่างไรก็ตามในการเล่นเกมต่อศัพท์ภาษาอังกฤษ จะต้องใช้กลยุทธ์ และเทคนิคในการลงคำศัพท์บนกระดานต่างๆ มากมาย ซึ่งมีความสำคัญไม่น้อยไปกว่าการจำคำศัพท์ ให้ได้มากๆ ดังนั้นท่านที่รักการเล่นเกมต่อศัพท์ภาษาอังกฤษจะต้องหมั่นฝึกฝนกลยุทธ์และเทคนิคการ เล่นไปพร้อมๆ กับการเพิ่มจำนวนคำศัพท์ เพื่อให้การเล่นของท่านสมบูรณ์แบบที่สุด

ในระบบการเล่นเกมต่อศัพท์ภาษาอังกฤษแบบ OSPD (Official Scrabble Players Dictionary) ให้อ้างอิงเฉพาะคำศัพท์ที่พิมพ์ด้วยแบบอักษรขนาดเล็กเท่านั้น ในกรณีที่ต้องการอ้างอิง คำศัพท์ที่ยาวกว่า 8 ตัวอักษรให้เปิดดูใน Unabridged Merriam-Webster Dictionary (U.S.A) หรือ Merriam-Webster Dictionary 10th Collegiate Edition

ในระบบการเล่นเกมต่อศัพท์ภาษาอังกฤษแบบ SOWPODS (OSPD + OSW [Official Scrabble Words]) ให้อ้างอิงทั้งคำศัพท์ที่พิมพ์ด้วยแบบอักษรขนาดเล็กและขนาดใหญ่เอียง ในกรณีที่ต้องการอ้างอิงคำศัพท์ที่ยาวกว่า 8 ตัวอักษร ให้เปิดดูใน The Chamber Dictionary (U.K) ร่วมกับ Unabridged Merriam-Webster Dictionary (U.S.A.)

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
